

Dear Glory Ann,

I'm sending this letter to inform you about a situation at the NCHA. The grievance committee's chairman is Mr. Denny Dunn from Salt Lake City, Utah. Mr. Dunn was arrested for theft and ultimately had several indictments against him for fraud. On October 17, 2017 Mr. Dunn plead guilty and was fined \$95,000.00. In addition, he received a very lengthy prison sentence that was probated. The fraud charges against Mr. Dunn represented a felony and by pleading guilty, he is now a convicted felon. The reason this is so important is that he, along with others, has held him up to be the moral authority of the NCHA by passing judgment on members that come before his committee. More often than not, he and the committee members who looked to him for guidance made several bad decisions that were either overturned or cost the NCHA huge attorney fees that resulted in the NCHA having to reconsider their sanctions in out-of-court settlements.

Court records also reveal that Mr. Dunn has taken bankruptcy not once but twice. All of the above information can be verified by contacting the Salt Lake City Court house. The cases and the bankruptcies are public record under the name of Denton Lynn Dunn.

Hoping to keep these facts withheld from the membership (as they often do with anything of concern) the NCHA has not acknowledged this problem, and further more has yet to relieve Mr. Dunn of any official NCHA duties (in direct conflict of the requirements for holding any official position within the association). I pass this on to out of the growing concern for the welfare of the NCHA. For too often, our officials do back door deals, are involved in lawsuits, and rarely keep members abreast of anything that could appear to be detrimental to the association.
